Potential Growth Discussion Guide Lesson 1 - Hard (May 19, 2024)

Opening Discussion: What do you enjoy planting each spring in your gardens?

Dive Deeper:

- 1. Read the Parable of the Four Soils in Matthew 13:1-23. What is a parable? What would be the advantage of using parables? Discuss why Jesus chose to teach with parables. Share a parable that has enlightened your heart such as: The Parable of the Mustard Seed, Yeast, Lost Coin, Lost Son, Lost Sheep, etc.
- 2. Why would the Parable of the Four Soils be relatable for Jesus' audience? Share how you have used a relatable story to help an individual's understanding of a point you were trying to convey.
- 3. Who is the sower in this parable? What does the seed represent? List the four soils that represent four different spiritual conditions of the heart.
- 4. What is the soil in Matthew 13:4 called in other versions of the Bible? With your gardening knowledge, why won't scattered seeds grow on a beaten down path?
- 5. Read Matthew 13:19. What does seed sown on hardened soil represent? Discuss possible reasons for a hardened heart. Read Mark 8:16-21 and discuss the surprising condition of the disciples' hearts. When have you experienced a time when God's truth fell to the wayside and didn't take hold of your heart?
- 6. Some people do not understand God's truth because their hearts are not ready to hear and receive it. What is a believer's responsibility when God's truth seems to be snatched from someone's life? What is a believer's responsibility in preventing a spiritual hardening of their own heart?

Application: How will you apply Sunday's message and this discussion to your life?
